The Purpose of the Role

The Head of Computing is the school's strategic lead for digital learning from Nursery to Year 8, inspiring pupils and colleagues alike to make imaginative, creative, safe and rigorous use of technology.

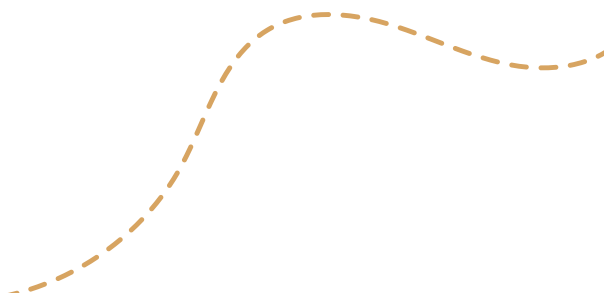
Alongside outstanding classroom teaching, the post-holder will:

- To design and deliver a coherent, forward-looking Computing and Digital Literacy curriculum.
- To lead, champion and develop educational technology across all subjects; and run a vibrant Robotics and Coding Club, preparing pupils for internal showcases and external competitions.

The position reports to the Deputy Head (Curriculum) and is a member of the Middle Leadership Team.

Key Responsibilities:

Teaching & Learning

- Teach Computing across the full age range (Year 1 to Year 8), modelling outstanding practice.
 - Write and review schemes of work that blend computational thinking, digital creativity and real-world problem-solving.
 - Embed cross-curricular uses of technology (e.g. data logging in science, animation in English).
 - Assess, track and report on pupil progress using agreed whole-school systems.
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Co-Curricular Leadership

- Lead weekly Robotics, E Sports & Coding Clubs
- Coordinate entries for local and national competitions (e.g. First Lego League).
- Arrange visiting speakers for TED Talks and industry links and themed events such as Safer Internet Day and AI Hackathons.
- Organise and plan Creative Technology and Innovator (CTI) Days for local primary schools
- Organise and Plan STEAM Days for Years 5 to 8

Leadership and Whole-School EdTech Strategy

- Shape the vision for technology-enhanced learning in consultation with SLT and IT Support
- To Lead the accreditation of gaining Microsoft Showcase School Status
- Work with the IT Manager to lead the IT Strategy Meeting
- Support and present at the Ed Tech Governors' Committee Meetings
- Manage the departmental budget, inventory and long-term resource plan.
- Oversee assessment, recording and reporting within the department.
- Working with the IT Manager evaluate, procure and implement hardware and software solutions, monitor impact on learning.
- Lead INSET for colleagues on digital pedagogy, safeguarding online and data protection (GDPR).

Safeguarding & Compliance

- Uphold the highest standards of e-safety; advise the DSL on filtering, monitoring and digital resilience.
- Contribute to inspection readiness, policy writing and risk assessments related to computing.

Community Engagement

- Promote Computing through newsletters, social media and open mornings.
- Forge partnerships with our partner school, other senior schools, universities and tech companies.
- Offer workshops for parents on digital literacy and online safety.
